# Common Heliotrope

*Heliotropium europaeum*

Native to Europe, Asia, and North Africa, but widely naturalised elsewhere, including Australia and North America.

## Description

Prostrate to ascending annual herb to 60 cm high.

Plants have a well developed root system and emit an ill-smelling odour when crushed.

Leaves 1.5–9 cm long, 0.8–3 cm wide, ovate, paler below, leaf stalk to 4 cm long. Leaves grey-green, hairy, leaf base tapering to the leaf stalk.

Fruit consisting of 4 shortly hairy or hairless mericarps, 1.6–2 mm long.

Seed-like segments of fruit (mericarps) ovate, brown, 1–1.5 mm wide.
