Native to South America

Description

A shrub of up to 5 m high with glaucous leaves and tubular yellow flowers. All plant parts are extremely poisonous.

Leaves are stalked, alternate, elliptical to lanceolate or oval, pointed, bluish or greyishgreen.

Flowers are greenish-yellow, 30 to 40 mm long, many are borne in a lax panicle. The corolla is tubular with a short-lobed limb.

Fruit are egg-shaped, two-valved capsules, 7 to 10 mm long and slightly longer than the persistent papery calyx.

Seeds. It produces a large quantity of tiny seeds, which can be dispersed by wind and water.
