Native to Europe and Asia.

Description

Slightly aromatic, mint-like, perennial herb with one to several erect stems to 0.7 m.

Leaves a rosette of rough, lobed, deeply-veined, stalked leaves with scalloped edges. Flowering stems grow from centre of rosette.

Stems flowering stem is quadrangular, to 0.7 m high, with small unstalked leaves.

Flowers blue to purple, in whorls of six, widely spaced along the terminal part of the stem, Jul-Nov.
